

Swiss Championships – Scoring System

For all national competitions, a Coach Card must be submitted at least 2 weeks before the first day of competition.

At the Swiss Championships, all Technical Routines and the Team Free routines will be judged using the new judging system, including the difficulty declaration on the Coach Card and synchronization deductions recorded by the Synchronization Controllers. Video clips of free hybrids and acrobatics must be sent in together with the Coach Card. This will help ensure that the competition runs as smoothly as possible. In contrast to the new rules, if a mistake is made in the Coach Card in the declaration of a free hybrid or acrobatic, the difficulty will be adjusted to reflect the difficulty executed and not be reduced to the base mark. The submission of video clips will help identify possible problems before the competition and ensure that the controllers are well prepared for the competition. Technical Elements must be performed as declared on the Coach Card or will result in a zero for that element.

In order to assess the feasibility of using the new system with other events, we ask for a preregistration by March 1st. Depending on the number of entries, the federation maintains the right to decide if the other free routine events will be scored with the old system. However, a Coach Card must be submitted for all routines, even if it is determined that it will not be possible to score all events with the new system.
